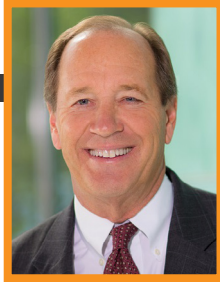

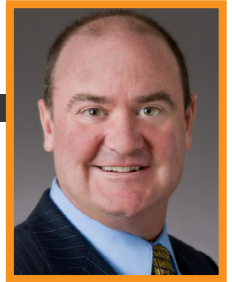
Dr. David Kohl
